Land Conservation is an extremely important topic, especially in the foxhunting community. For a Foxhunt to happen, a fixture is needed. No fixture, no hunt. With a fixture comes responsibility from the hunt members and guests. Some essential habits for me as a junior member are cleaning up after myself and my mount. If my horse happens to drag shavings or manure out of the trailer while unloading, I pick up the shavings and spread the manure per the request of our fixture land owner. I also make sure I always thank the landowner if given the chance. Another habit is being aware of fields around me that are planted with crops. I do my best to steer clear of them and not create ruts or holes from my horse's hooves. While the meaning of Land Conservation varies, this is just my idea and opinion of it. Conservation of hunting land is important to me because Foxhunting is the highlight of my week, month, and year. As a junior whipper-in and member, I try my hardest to be involved and helpful. Some of these things include- hound washing in summer months, flea baths, hound exercising in the off-season, cleaning the huntsman's hound/horse trailer, and many other tasks. Do those things have anything to do with land conservation? No, not really. But they are important to me because they help me do my part to help the huntsman and hounds for hunts. I couldn't imagine my life without Foxhunting. The rush of excitement and adrenaline I feel when I hear the hounds erupt into a full-cry chase, or when I get a perfect view of the game dashing out of the cover with the hounds hot on it's trail. That's what it's all about for me. Even on those bad scenting days, having the privilege to participate and watch and listen to the hound's work, it's truly a unique experience I can't describe. Being in the hunt field, all worries just float away and all I'm focused on is the hunt and the hounds. Without Land Conservation, fixtures would disappear, as would foxhunts. That is why I try my hardest to do my part in taking care of the land we have the privilege to hunt on to help ensure the future of foxhunting.

While I have always loved hunting ever since I started when I was 7, this wonderful mare is such a joy to hunt on and makes the experience even better. She has turned into quite the seasoned hunt/whip horse since we started together at 7 & 12 to now at 11 & 16.
